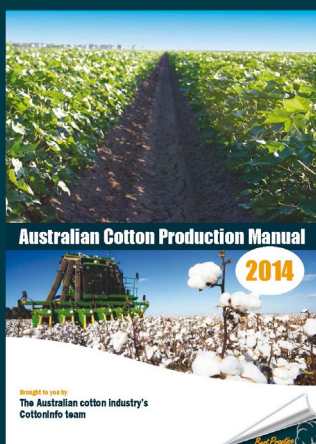




Information for raingrown growers.

CottonInfo is the Australian cotton industry's joint extension program, designed to connect growers - both irrigated and raingrown - with research.

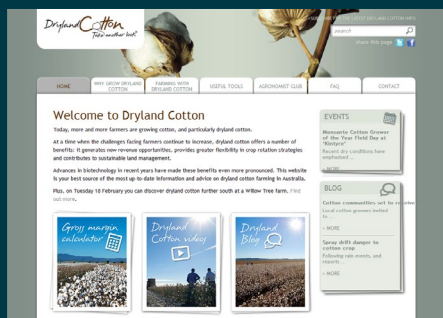
More and more farmers are diversifying into cotton, particularly raingrown cotton. Here are two of the key sources of information for raingrown growers:
