Picking Update

Picking across the Balonne and MacIntyre is in progress with St George and Dirranbandi near completed bar a few late crops. Goondiwindi is progressing and is estimated to be around 50% picked.

Preliminary indications are very good with some growers talking of highest ever farm average yields (estimates based on round module produced). Gin feedback indicates the round modules are weighing a bit light due to the excellent dry picking conditions and that processing has been fractionally slower than normal - seems harder to separate the lint from the seed. Out turns have been reported as good (ie. 43% 746BRF, 45% 748BRF) aided by good defoliation results.

Effect of residual herbicides applied at camera spray rates during fallow on the subsequent cotton crop.

Camera sprayers have increased in popularity with overall big reductions in chemical use in fallow fields. High chemical rates can be applied to individual weeds when a number of nozzles fire. This can have residual chemical carryover effects on the following cotton crop.

All herbicides were applied at 1X, 2X, 4X and 8X rates on 30 Jul 2021. Cotton planted 7 Oct 2021, Sicot 714B3F.

Take home message.

Be conservative with residual herbicides, especially at high (camera sprayer) rates. Often when two or more nozzles fire the rates are considerably higher than the already high permit rate. Be wary of combinations of herbicides, they may have reduced safety margins. The more herbicides, the more chances for damage. Be aware of potential additive effects when











using residuals in summer crop after applying residual herbicides in the winter phase and vice versa. Some interactions can linger longer in the soil.

Seasonal Outlook

The <u>CottonInfo Moisture manager for May</u> is indicating a move towards drier conditions (approaching El Nino) for the coming months May to July (below) for most regions. The drier outlook is supported by the BoM outlook for the same period.




Figure 3: May to July seasonal outlook from CottonInfo Moisture Manager




Fig 4: Bureau of Meteorology Seasonal Outlook for Moisture for May to July. These outlooks can be found at <u>Overview—Summary - Climate Outlooks (bom.gov.au)</u>













El Niño and rainfall impacts


